The Lenten Season

The season of Lent is observed from Ash Wednesday through Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It has traditionally been a time set aside for fasting, prayer and reflection before celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

Lent has been observed since the early days of the Christian church, but many of the practices and traditions have evolved over the years. Some of these traditions involved giving up meat and fats during Lent. The French term "Mardi Gras" is translated as Fat Tuesday (*Tuesday Fat*) and is the day before Ash Wednesday when households used up all the fat in cooking so as to not have any around during Lent.

In recent times, some Christians have opted to "give up" something for Lent. This might be sugar, sweets, or something associated with a bad habit. Lately, others have decided to "Give Something" for Lent. This may mean giving donations to charitable organizations or giving of one's time to family and friends.

Please carefully read the article on page 2 of this newsletter for an explanation of the difference in how our congregation will proceed with the Call process during the next several months. This will be a busy time for many of us and we, as a Council would like to ask of you, the congregation to "Give" of yourselves in many ways.

- Prayer Please pray for our congregation during this time of transition and pray for the Call process. Pray that we will be guided in the right direction and discernment.
- Worship Worship in person or on-line. We need to keep gathering as a community of faith. We need to hear the Word together, pray and sing together, and celebrate the Meal together at the table of our Lord.
- Give of your time and your talents. We still need members to help with a myriad of tasks and duties. This could be something as big as coordinating the Easter breakfast or Vacation Bible School. Or it could be something as simple as volunteering to open and/or lock up the building on Sunday mornings or tidying up the pews after worship.

As St. Paul writes in the book of Romans, Chapter 1, vs 8, "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world."

Time of Transition and the Call Process

In 2019, the Synod assigned an Interim Pastor to us who presided over worship, had office hours, and led the congregation through the Transition and Call process.

In 2025, there are many congregations in the Rocky Mountain Synod without a pastor and there are not enough Interim pastors to assist all those congregations.

For a couple of years now, the Synod has tried a different approach – a Transition Consultant. In this scenario, the congregation finds pulpit supply for worship and for member visitation. Often, this might be three to four pastors who fill in on a rotating basis. The Transition Consultant leads the congregation through the Transition and Call process. This is still similar to before in that:

- We form a Transition Team
- We complete the Discovery Process
- The Transition Team reports to the Council
- The Call Committee is selected
- Ministry Site Profile (MSP) is Completed

At the February 11 meeting, the Immanuel Council met with the LECM Board, Pr. Libbie Reinking (our Synod Transition Coach), and Pr. Dominic Palacios, who is a Transition Consultant. Following Pr. Dominic's presentation and a question/answer session, both the Immanuel Council and the LECM Board approved hiring Pr. Dominic Palacios. He will be working with us on separate, but parallel tracks for the process. There are still some unknowns as to the outcome at the end of the process. Perhaps our two ministries will still be considered a joint ministry with one pastor called to serve both. Perhaps LECM will call its own pastor and Immanuel call its own part-time pastor. 
